The largest percentage was mad in the Ford factory of 29 boys, wh have been there under apprentice sys tem for periods of from three to 1 months. They earned \$18,562, and c this sum saved \$4,640.60, or 25 pe cent. of their earnings. Five boy earned \$1,000 during the year and 2 \$500 each.
