### **Clips Five Seconds Off Former** Mark; Becomes World's Champion

Special to the Telegraph Columbus, O., Aug. 17. — The free-for-all pace on the Columbus Grand Circuit program yesterday produced the fastest racing time of the year. In the first heat Napoleon Direct won in 1:59 %, with Peter Stevens, the second horse, doing his mile in two minutes flat. It was the first time in a driving career of 45 years that Edward Geers ever drove a mile in better than two minutes.

The pace was slower through the first half of the next heat and Napoleon Direct was four lengths back at the far turn. He closed with a won derful rush and finished a head in front of Single G. Separate timing caught Napoleon Direct in 561/2 sec onds in the last half.

#### World's Champion

In a time trial Directum I became the world's champion pacer for 1 1-16 miles. The old record was 2:14%, made by Cherry Lass in 1904. Off to a slow start, Directum I covered the distance in 2:09%. The last mile was paced in 2:00 1/4.

was paced in 2:00 %. Miss Harris M., the champion four-year-old pacing mare, failed in an ef-fort to lower her mark of 2:01 %. She was tired when the final quarter was reached and finished the mile in 2:02. Napoleon Direct was one of three winning favorites. In the 2:09 pace Beth Clark, the second choice, won the first two heats. Thereafter Baby Bertha, highest in public favor, was in command and took the next three heats. 
#### Leo Houck's Boxers Win in Game at Lancaster
