U. S. STEEL MAKES STEADY PROGRESS

Touches 94; Shipping Stocks Continue in Favor; Motors Gain

New York, Aug. 21. - Steel's progress was steady but none the less impressive, the stock touching 94 before noon. Shipping stocks continued in favor, with new higher records for Marine common and preferred at 29 1/2 and 28 1/2, respectively; Atlantic Gulf and West Indies achieving the same distinction in its rise to 73 with further gains in Pacific Mail and United Fruit. All branches of the list were included in movement, except rails, Reading and Union Pacific furnishing the only strength in that quarter. Motors registered a gain of 4 points, with 1 to 2 for Equipments, coppers and other active specialties. Bonds were steady.
