



Ministers who have made application for a change in the ruling are content to have all children under the prescribed age for-bidden from all services but say they see no reason why adults should be prohibited from attending Sunday school while church services are open to them. Im-mediate steps were taken to quaran-tine the 550 boys at the college and postpone indefinitely the return of 800 other students who have been away on a summor leave of absence.
