



Allies Take Over Control of Postal and Telegraphic Lines Throughout Greece

By Associated Press Crowd They con and London, Sept. 4. — The Greek Government at Athens has accepted the demands of the entente powers in their entirety and agents of the French and British Governments are to-day taking over the control of postal and telegraphic communication.

British and French Ministers at Athens presented on Saturday a note to the Greek Government demanding control of the posts, telegraph and system on the ground that they were being used by enemies of the entente, demanded that agents of the Teutonic allies employed in corruption and es-pionage must immediately leave Greece, and that measures be taken against Greek subjects guilty of complicity therein.
