



Washington, Sept. 9.-Joseph Morin, an American, was among the crew saved from the British steamer Rievaulx Abbey, sunk off Hull, England, on September 3, according to reports to-day to the State Department, from Consul Hathaway, at Hull. He said Consul Hathaway, at Hull. He said the vessel probably struck a mine. The crew of 27 and 5 passengers were saved and landed at Hull. Two sailors lost their lives. The vessel was enroute from Rotterdam. Consul Hathaway also reported that no Americans were aboard the French steamer Ville D'Oran, sunk off Scarborough September 5 or on the Danish steamer Farmatyr, sunk September 2 near Yarmouth by a mine or torpedo.
