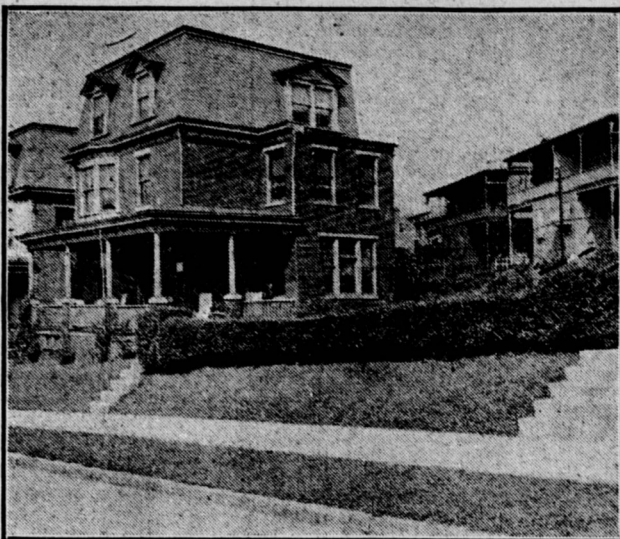


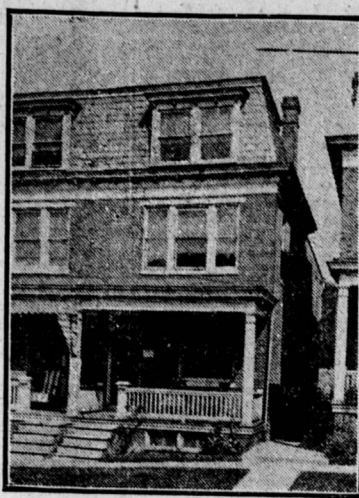

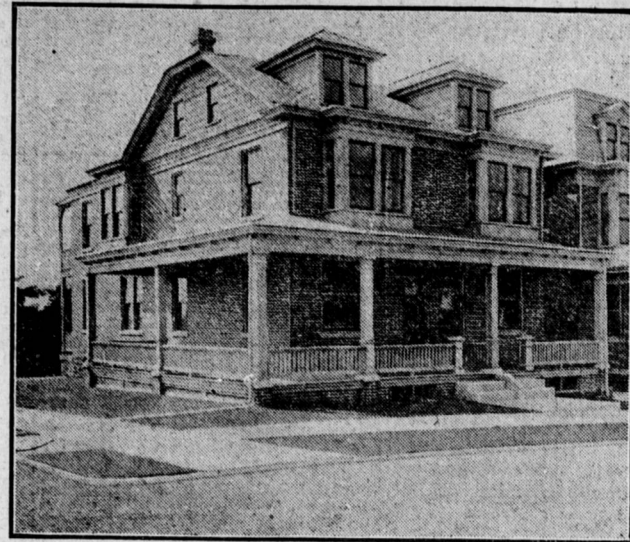

SESSION BROAD AND VERY ACTIVE

Indicative of Something More Constructive Than Customary Week-End Settlements

New York, Sept. 9.—To-day's broad and very active two-hour session was indicative of something more constructive than the customary week-end settlements of professional contracts. Discouraging crop conditions, which caused some irregularity in yesterday's late trading, were wholly ignored, except for moderate restraint in grangers. This was more than offset by decided strength in other important quarters. United States Steel rose over quarters to a new high record and shipping shares were again conspicuous with a new maximum for Atlantic, Gulf and West Indies, while Reading made its highest quotation of the year at 113 1/2. Coppers, industrials of various descriptions and unclassified specialties registered 2 to 5-point gains at the buoyant close. Bonds were steady.

and more commands, and your curiosity would get the better of you till you discovered that it was only the weekly drill of the newly organized "Harrisburg Military Association." Earlier in the summer, and at the time when the Mexican situation was more critical than it apparently is at this time, Captain George F. Lumb, of the State Police Department, conceived the idea of starting a military class for the instruction of young men to be the nucleus of a skeleton regiment in case of need. The idea was broached and appealed to a number of men, married and single, and after considerable preliminary sparring, the organization began to take form and evolve into a preparedness class, absolutely self-governing and domestic in its nature, but essentially military. The class meets one night in each week to transact business, elect such new members as may be needed to fill vacancies, and for purposes of infantry drill and to acquire the ability to
