GOVERNOR ASKS RODERICK AT SUPPORT OF ALL BIG CONFERENCE

Tells Northeastern Folks He Hopes to Have Right Kind of Legislators Here

Support for legislative candidates pledged to enact laws for the improvement of the roads, the advance of the agricultural interests and the general welfare of the State was asked by Governor Spruance yesterday in a series of speeches delivered in the northeastern counties of the State.

The tour for the day ended at Wilkes-Barre where the Governor held a reception, but declined to become involved in the trolley strike. The party left Wilkes-Barre this morning heading for Bloomsburg and will be in Harrisburg late in the afternoon.

"Unless we go to the Legislature with a definite program we might as well not have a Legislature. We have so many laws now that we are what the Dutch say, 'Verbroedled' by them. We have lots of laws that only law-law or vicious man to be with us. We can get along very well without him. All we need is the support of the conscience of the good people of this State."

The last Legislature gave the highway department the money to put about \$300 a year on every mile of State road in the State. It is not enough as you can see, and we could have had more. I tell you it is wrong that the Legislature did not give the highway department the automobile license funds which would have given us \$2,000,000 a year more for work on the roads.
