Four Policemen and Nine Rioters Shot in Battle at Standard Oil Plant

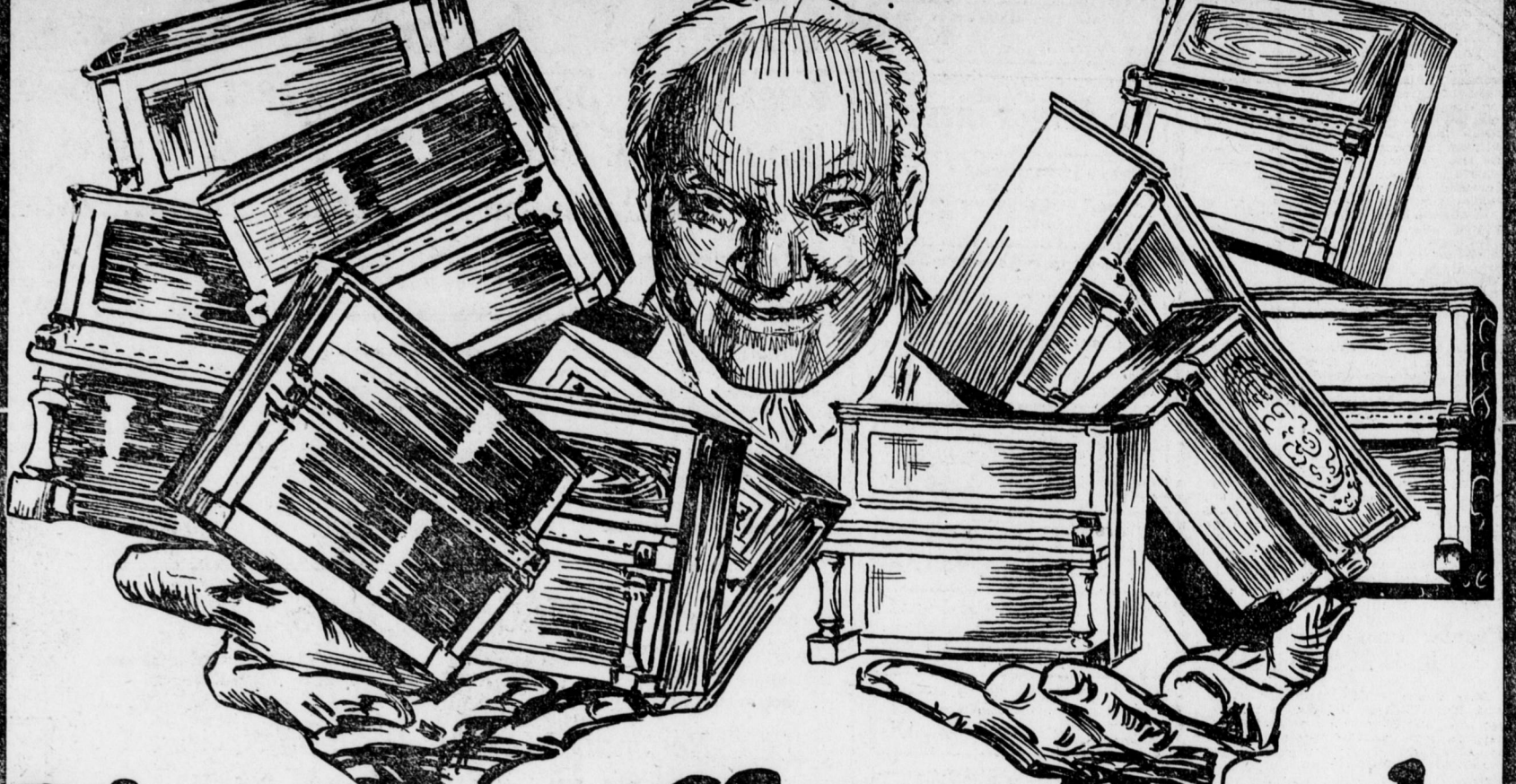
Bayonne, N. J., Oct. 11.—Virtually all the police of this city are on guard about the plants of the Standard Oil Company, the Tidewater Oil Company, Bergen Point Chemical Works and Vacuum Oil Company at Constable Hook where four policemen and nine rioters were wounded yesterday in a battle between the police and 1,000 strikers. Two of the strikers are not expected to recover. The policemen were not dangerously hurt. The police are armed with repeating rifles and sawed-off shot guns and most of them were entrenched early to-day before the yards of the Tidewater Oil Company while the strikers and their sympathizers gathered a block away. The rioting was an outgrowth of a strike of 1500 employees of the Standard Oil Works which closed that plant, throwing 3,000 more men out. Six hundred men of the Vacuum Oil Company and 200 of the Tidewater Oil Company employees joined the strike. The strikers attempted yesterday to blockade a trolley line by upsetting a flat car on the rails whereupon the police charged them and the shooting ensued. The trolley lines leading to the industrial plants were barricaded by strikers and sympathizers to-day and no cars were running. The companies' employees went to work by roundabout routes, many being transported on tugboats and motorboats. After a small disturbance early in the day the police arrested two men and it was asserted that many of the strikers and their followers appeared to be carrying weapons. Late police forced open the avenue and cars began to run.

Municipal League, Rotary and C. of C. to Boost Proposed School Loan

Back of the movement for the passage of the proposed high school loan will be the Municipal League, Rotary club, and Harrisburg Chamber of Commerce. These live-wire organizations are already planning for a vigorous campaign which will continue up to and throughout election day. The Municipal League was a big factor in the passage of former loans and its members are already showing much activity in the interest of the school. The need for a new high school will be demonstrated by facts and figures. President J. William Bowman of the Chamber of Commerce has named his committee and the first meeting will be held Saturday at 12.30 at the Harrisburg Club. Plans will be discussed for starting work on the following Monday. J. Horace McFarland is chairman of this committee. He will have as his co-workers, Arthur D. Bacon, J. Austin Brandt, William Jennings, Herman Miller, Frank C. Sites, John F. Swaney and the secretary of the Chamber, E. L. McColgin.

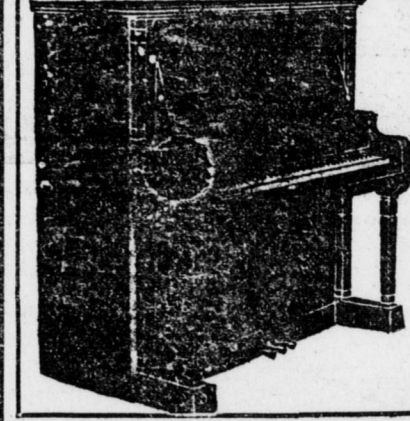
