NEGRO MURDERED; TWO ARE INJURED

Southern Stabs Charles Smith, of Steelton, to Death in Ward Quarrel

One negro was murdered and two others seriously injured "accidentally," they claim, in a series of disorders which caused the police to work overtime since yesterday afternoon.

A formal charge of murder will probably be made to-morrow against James Frazier, aged 30, a Southern negro, who is under arrest, accused of stabbing and fatally wounding Charles Smith, of Steelton, during an argument in the Eighth ward yesterday afternoon.

Officers Buch and Gardner, after searching for an hour, located Frazier just as he was about to leave the city. Witnesses have been found, the police claim, who will identify Frazier as the man who stabbed Smith, although Frazier denied when arrested that he was guilty.
