New York, Oct. 24. — Official announcement of the terms of the new loan to Great Britain by American financiers is expected here before the close of this week. The amount will be \$250,000,000 or \$300,000,000, it is understood, bearing five per cent interest, with the issuing price at 99 and maturing in two years. As security collateral representing between \$225,000,000 and \$350,000,000 will be offered, under tentative plans made public unofficially to-day. This would consist of American stocks and bonds mobilized by the British treasury and Canadian issues and obligations of neutral countries. The suggested terms are virtually the same as those arranged when Great Britain borrowed \$250,000,000 in the United States last August.
