Leaders Are Lower; Marines Make Big Jumps Up-

New York, Nov. 8 .- The excitement of the first hour subsided materially, later stocks meantime recording further feverish advances and recessions. Leaders like United States and Lackawanna Steels, Utah Copper and Republican Iron were lower by substantial fractions to over a point from Monday's final prices. The list railed again under heavy buying of Marines, the common and preferred rising from 3 to 4 points. Central Leather and Sloss Sheffield also moved forward leather to the new record of 110. Detrichem Steel also was undisturbed edited situation, advancing 15 o 634, exceeding its previous y six points. At midday the second again became excessively active and strong with U. S. Steel at the new high record of 126. Bonds were firm.
