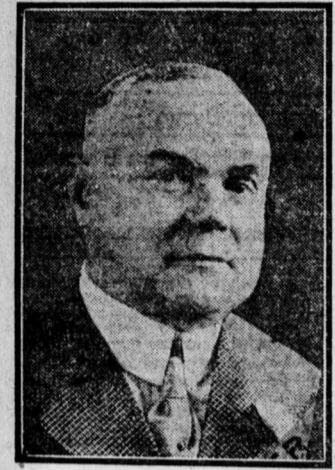




J. W. SWARTZ, Republican, Re-elected to the Legislature

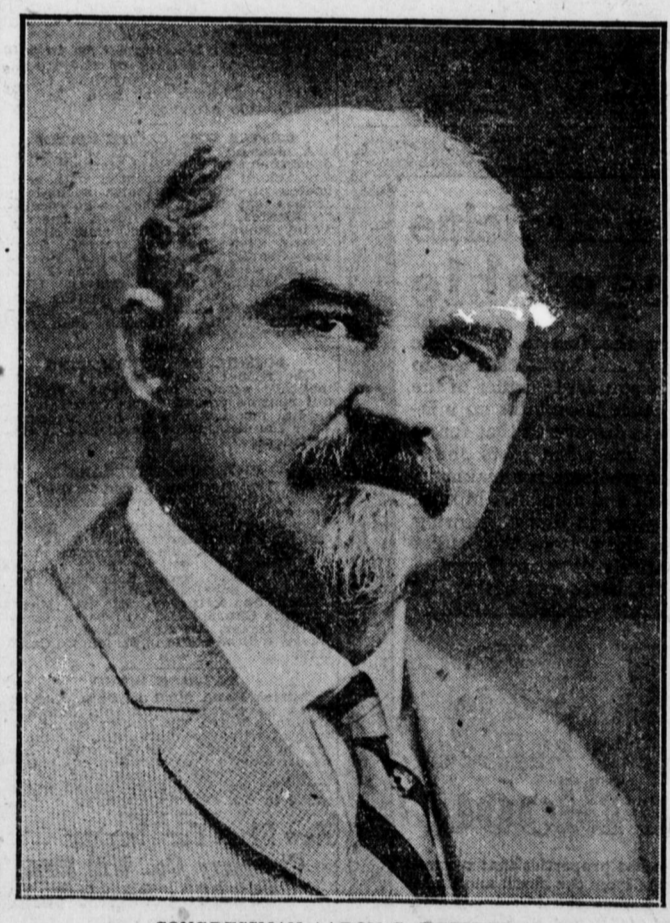

Delaware Gives Hughes Big Majority Unofficially Wilmington, Del., Nov. 8. — Returns from the State are slow in coming in, as the districts are large and the ballot hard to count. Results in Wilmington, however, give good indication of the result. The city vote is as follows: President—Hughes, 11,492; Wilson, 10,523; Hughes' majority, 970. United States Senator — Du Pont, R., 10,882; Wolcott, D., 10,647; Du Pont's majority, 235. Congress — Miller, R., 11,459; Polk, D., 10,154; Miller's majority, 1,305. Governor — Townsend, R., 11,700; Hughes, D., 10,285; Townsend's majority, 1,415. Attorney General — Reinhardt, R., 11,801; Chayton, D., 10,703; Reinhardt's majority, 1,098. According to unofficial reports from the State districts, these Wilmington results give the State to Hughes and elect the entire Republican ticket with the exception of United States Senator and Attorney General. The complexion of the next Legislature is in doubt.
