

### No Shortage of Coal,

New York, Nov. 22. — There is no "shortage" of coal but there is an increased demand, E. B. Thomas, president of the Lehigh Valley Railroad Company, said to-day in a statement setting forth what he declared were the "chief reasons" for the present excitement in the coal market. During ten months ending with September he asserted, \$5,800,620 tons were shipped from the anthracite region, an increase of \$560,673 tons over the amount during the same period in 1915 and 1914 and these figures "dispose of the theory so erroneously and persistently put forth by persons who have no knowledge of the coal trade."


