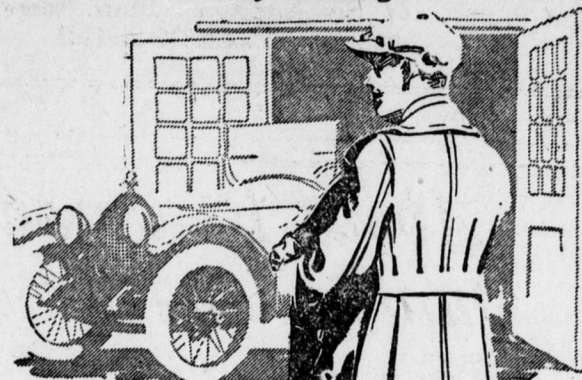

Observance of 400th Anniversary of Protestant Reformation by Lutherans

Mechanicsburg, Pa., Nov. 24. — Plans have been formulated by the pastors of the General Council and General Synod Lutheran Churches, of Mechanicsburg and vicinity consisting of the Rev. H. Hall Sharp, of Trinity; the Rev. Dr. H. N. Fegley, of St. Mark's; the Rev. S. S. Garnes, of Trindle Spring and the Rev. H. K. Lantz, of St. John's, Shiremanstown, to hold a joint celebration of the four hundredth anniversary of the Protestant Reformation in Franklin Hall on Sunday evening, January 14, 1917.

A large chorus will furnish music and prominent ministers from a distance will be the speakers. Each pastor will appoint five laymen, who, with the pastors will constitute the executive committee. They will meet with the pastors on Monday evening, December 4, in Trinity Lutheran Church, Mechanicsburg.
