Dr. Kirk Tells How

Dr. E. C. Kirk, dean of the University of Pennsylvania dental school, addressed a large audience in the Technigh school auditorium last night under the auspices of the Harrisburg Dental Society.

Dr. Kirk in a most able manner and much such language as the layman could understand and appreciate concisely explained the relationship existing between the nervee with which the teeth are connected with the other organs and functions of the body. He proved how irritation of these nerve endings could produce disturbances in other places quite remote from the seat of the trouble.

After dwelling at some length upon the micro-organisms of the mouth and their effect upon the teeth and the adjacent tissues he took up the particular purpose of his message, which was to demonstrate the effects of disturbances of dental origin upon the mentality of the subject. Numerous sildes were shown and records produced which demonstrated the relief and cure of cases of epilepsy, St. Vius dance, imbecility loss of memory and various other mental disorders.
