New York, Dec. 12. — The refusal of the International League to abide by the decision of the baseball's supreme tribunal, the National Commission, in granting the Brooklyn National League club \$9,000 in its claim against the defunct Newark club was the principal topic of consideration when the representations of the National and International Leagues and the American Association resumed their deliberations here to-day.
