HOW TO BAKE AND SAVE EGGS

In the words of the Apostle, "Rejoice and yet 'again I say, 'rejoice!" The latest advices tell us that flour has dropped a dollar a barrel in Chicago. It sounds encouraging with Christmas on the way and so much baking to be done. The heavy, rich fruit cake of years gone by has always been a heavy drain on the pocketbook. Here is a toothsome substitute which can be made even by the woman who boycotts eggs.

Cream sugar, shortening and salt. Add beaten egg yolk and chocolate which was melted in one cup of boiling water. Sift baking powder into flour and add. Dissolve soda in a half cup bolling water and add. Flavor with vanilla.

Frosting

Boil 1½ cups sugar and ½ cup water until it threads. Pour on beaten white of one egg. Flavor. Beat until stil enough to spread.
