Commissioners Set Aside That Sum to Sinking Funds; \$126,904 Now



Dauphin county, to-day reduced its bonded indebtedness by just \$15,976.82 when it gave its check to the Commonwealth Trust Company, trustee of the sinking funds, for that sum to be set aside in the sinking fund toward the eventual redemption of the uses. The portions were

three bond issues. The portions were divided as follows: 1901 193.16; 1902, \$1,309.42; 1903, \$7,-474.24. The 1903 issue which is due for redemption in 1918 was floated for \$121,000; 1902, due in 1932, for \$51,-\$121,000; 1902, due in 1932, for \$51,-000; 1901, due in 1931 for \$249,000, a total of \$421,000. In the sinking funds January 1, 1916, just \$269,-108.69 had been set aside and to this will be added approximately \$9,000 in interest earnings, making a total of \$225,085.41 plus the sum set aside by the county sniking fund commissioners yesterday of \$15,976.82, makes the total available for debt redemption, \$294,085.41. And when you deduct this from the total debt of \$421,000 you've got exactly what the county's net indebtedness is to date \$-\$126,904.59.
