# PRICES GENERALLY TAKE BIG DROP

Trading Listless Because of Lack of Outside Interest;

U. S. Steel Recedes

New York, Dec. 26. — Trading became exceedingly listless after the first hour on the lack of outside interest. A general dropping of prices occurred, Marines, Central Leather occurred, Marines, Central Leather and U. S.
