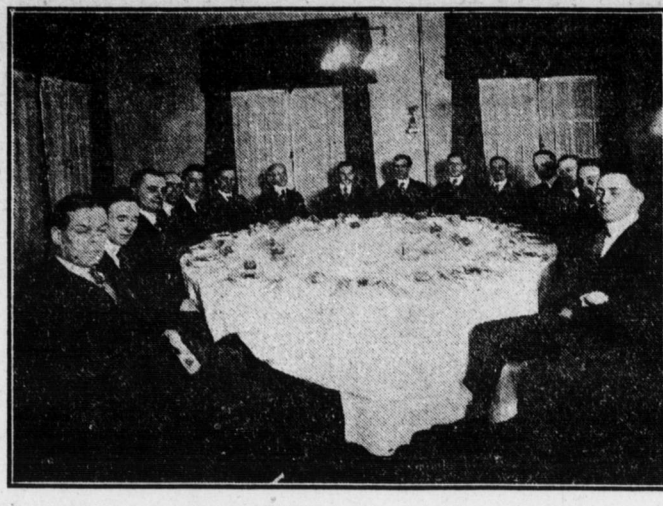

Gain of Almost Two Points on Scale of Ten Thousand Shares

New York, Jan. 6.—United States Steel led the active list to higher levels at the outset of to-day's trading with a gain of almost two points on the scale of 10,000 shares at 112 to 112 1/2.
