Britain's National Debt Climbs to \$10,665,738,220

London, Dec. 29. — The interest on the debt created under the war loans of 1914-15 amounted during the financial year ended March. 31 last to £38,445,856 (\$192,229,280), according to a white paper issued recently.

The total capital national debt, which on March 31, 1915, was £1,104,967,076 (\$5.524,832,380) had increased by March 31, 1916, to £2,133,147,644 (\$10,665,738,220), the statement shows.
