Formal Cabinet Member Is Dead

MacVeagh resided while in Harrisburg in the house adjoining the old Cameron mansion on Front street. He was prominent in State politics and was elected once, as an earlier independent Republican movement in this State.

Wayne MacVeagh was born on a farm near Jonesville, Chester county, Pa., in April, 1832. He was graduated from Yale in 1852 and was admitted to the bar at West Chester, Pa., in 1854. He was district attorney from 1859 to 1867; served in the Civil War as a captain of infantry in 1862 and a captain of cavalry in 1863. He was elected chairman of the Pennsylvania Republican central committee in 1863. He was United States minister to Turkey in 1876-78.
