The Hammershus entered at port at 10 o'clock last night and dropped anchor close to the German ships. It took on board a large number of cases and then attempted to leave the harbor.

OUTPOSTS ARE ORDERED BACK

Then Troops Will Be Withdrawn From Mexico; No Decision as to Fletcher

Washington, D. C., Jan. 23.—Withdrawal of the outposts of General Pershing's force in Mexico has been ordered by the War Department with the approval of President Wilson. There were intimations to-day that as soon as the outposts are brought in the movement of the main body of troops toward the border will be begun.

DELAYS PLANS FOR SPECIAL ELECTION

Senator E. E. Beidleman, who will have charge of the proposed amendment, has held frequent conferences with Solicitor Fox relative to the delay which was to-day recommended to the council. Both the senator and the solicitor have been endeavoring to find a way whereby the \$6,000 necessary to conduct such an election might be saved to the taxpayers. To accomplish this they must devise an amendment to the Clark act that will be constitutional and which will place the power of selecting a successor to Mr. Bowman either up to the regular elections, election by Council or appointment by the Mayor. The matter will be taken up in the Legislature immediately and every effort will be made to save the \$6,000 to the county.

BULGARS START NORTHERN MOVE

an effort to turn the Russian left flank by completing the crossing of the stream at this far easterly point. In any event it gives Field Marshal Von Mackensen a firmer hold on the Danube near its mouth, the only stretch where he had not already complete control of the river. Along the remainder of the Rumanian front there have been only engagements between advance detachments, these resulting favorably to the Teutonic forces notably in the Kasimov region, where a Russian attack in some force was repulsed, according to Berlin. Otherwise, the movements on the various fighting fronts have been mostly raiding enterprises. London officially announces the casualties from last Friday night's fighting in a British munitions plant chemical works at 69 killed, 72 seriously and 338 slightly injured.

Japan Is Confronted With an Internal Crisis

Tokio, Jan. 23. — Japan is confronted with a serious internal crisis. The opposition to the administration of Count Terauchi has opened a vigorous campaign on the ground that the Terauchi nonpartisan cabinet was formed in violation of the spirit of the constitution. The constitutional party, which has a majority in the House of Peers and is under the leadership of Viscount Kato, former minister of foreign affairs, has joined hands with the Nationalist group in the lower house for war against the cabinet.

Western Floods Subsiding After Making 25,000 Idle

Washington, Jan. 23. — The administration legislative program to-day was threatened with partial disruption as a result of the declaration of two grocers' strikes in Harrisburg. President Wilson that they believe no action could be secured on the general leasing and waterpower bills under opposition of the Senate. The Senate steering committee to-day took up speedily meetings in an effort to plan speedy action according to the wishes of President Wilson, who has determined to make frequent trips to the Capitol in an effort to expedite legislation.

German Consul Gets Two Years in Jail and Fine of \$10,000

San Francisco, Cal., Jan. 23.—For the first time in the history of the United States a foreign consul general, Franz Bopp, one of the three consuls general of Germany, in this country, was sentenced yesterday to prison and payment of a fine for violation of American neutrality. Judge Bushnell, in the United States District Court, sentenced Bopp to two years in the county jail and assessed an aggregate fine of \$10,000 against him, the prison and jail terms to run concurrently.

PROF. CARL O. MATZ KILLED

Lancaster, Pa., Jan. 23.—Professor Carl Matz, the idol of the local musical world, is dead. The 79-year-old musician, while adjusting a third-story window yesterday morning fell and his neck was broken on the pavement below.

Wilson Wants More Than One Nitrate Plant

Washington, Jan. 23. — President Wilson desires, if possible, to establish more than one nitrate plant in accordance with the provisions of the last army reorganization bill making available \$20,000,000 for the manufacture of nitrogen from the air for use in explosives for the government. Whether more than one plant will be constructed will depend upon the feasibility of different sites now being investigated by an inter-departmental committee, and the amount of money required.
