SCOTT RULES IN COMPENSATION

Indiana Man Issues Some Important Decisions in Regard to Recent Claims

In reversing an award made by Referee L. E. Christley in the case of Fischer vs. Pyszrowski an Allegheny county compensation case, Commissioner John A. Scott lays down the ruling that claims for compensation when death occurred from pneumonia

following an injury must be thoroughly established. "The burden was upon the claimant to establish by competent and convincing testimony that while engaged in the service of the defendant, the claimant's deceased husband suffered a personal injury of such a character as to be the proximate cause of the subsequent death," says he, "and that the line of causation between the accidental injury, if fully made out, and the death following a serious injury nor are such facts clearly established from which a safe inference can be drawn as to the occurrence or nature of the possible injury sustained."

The widow of Louis Witte, high constable and special police officer of Ellwood City, who was also employed

as a bartender and hotel man in a tavern in that borough, has been awarded compensation for the death of her husband as the result of a shot fired by A. F. Lyons, a guest at the hotel where he worked, and the landlord must pay the compensation according to another decision handed down today by Mr. Scott. The opinion says that Witte's duties as borough constable did not occupy much of his time and by agreement of the borough authorities he was permitted to accept employment in the hotel, the burgess reserving the right to call him from his employment at any time to perform the duties of a borough officer. The opinion expresses the thought that the hotel owner employed him "with the thought at least, that he could use him to maintain order in the bar room and on the hotel premises by reason of his being a special police officer." It is held that

when Witte went to the room of Lyons, who was making trouble, he was not hired as a special officer exclusively to preserve order nor did he go to the room of Lyons at the suggestion of the burgess. He was simply called by his employer during his regular working hours as a bar tender to look after a disturbance in the hotel.

The opinion states that Witte could not be shifted from the position of employe to that of public officer at the will of his employer. It is also held that the shooting was the result of an attack upon Witte as an employe who was endeavoring to quiet an obstreperous guest and not on any personal grounds.

The Board has dismissed the appeal in the case of Shepherd vs. Schlegel, a Reading case, on the ground that the testimony was hearsay and in the case of Captanelli vs. Jefferson and Clearfield Coal and Iron Co., a Jefferson county case, on the ground that the injury alleged was not suffered in course of employment.

Only one practice has been held since the game with the Hassett club, but the men are in the best of condition and expect to make a good showing on this trip. They are especially anxious to come back at Juniata, who handed them a defeat on the Lebanon Valley floor a couple weeks ago.
