Seek Improvements but They Are a Matter of Legislative Appropriations

State Highway Commissioner Black received delegations from Chester, Center and Westmoreland counties for many State highway improvements yesterday.

The delegation from Chester county which was headed by County Commissioner John E. Baldwin, of West Chester, took up with Commissioner Black the question of the improvement of Routes 137 and 273 and made the suggestion that Chester county would be satisfied if a portion of Route 137 were abandoned and this route were run into West Chester over Route 273.

Flinn, of Downingtown; Alfred Hollowell, Walter Lilly, Samuel McAllister, Elmore Sellers, all of Marshalltown; Patrick Cochran, Charles Sheller, Pennock Passmore, S. M. Barker and Alger Whitecroft, all of West Chester.
