FILE WRITS AGAINST SHIPS Manila, Feb. 12.—The Behnmeyer company, of Manila, a German firm, has procured writs of attachment against twenty-one German ships held by the American authorities at Ma-nila, Cebu and Hoilo to recover half a million pesos for maintenance of the vessels and their crews since the out-break of the war. 
