Steel rose a point with two for Lackawanna Steel and 1 to 3 for Marines, Atlantic Gulf and West Indies, Industrial Alcohol, Texas Company, Central Leather, National Enamelling and Pittsburgh Coal. Coppers and equipments made fractional advances and People's Gas regained 3½ points of its recent severe loss. Rails were again overshadowed at the outset but Canadian Pacific rose two points with irregularity elsewhere. U. S. Steel pfd., lost a point with Cuba Can Sugar.

Less than 150,000 shares changed hands in the first hour and this measure of activity was materially reduced later, the market becoming almost motionless before noon. Reactions of 1 to 3 points occurred after the first hour except in rails where initial prices were mostly extended. Canadian Pacific gained almost 3 points with 1 to 1½ for Union Pacific, Atchison, New York Central, Lehigh Valley and Rock Island. Amons special stocks, Texas Company, Alcohol, Central Leather, American Woole, French 5's featured the bond list.
