DOWNES URGES WIDER USE OF NIGHT SCHOOLS

Superintendent Says at Least 500 Adults Would Like Additional Training

Wider use of public night schools was urged to-day by Dr. Downes, city school superintendent. "I am sure that there are at least 500 adults in this city who are in need of better educational training, and if they only make known their needs, I feel sure the school board will provide at once for additional teachers and rooms in various buildings.

125 In Continuation Classes

Instructors at the Wickersham building for the night classes are John P. Scott and M. H. Layton, while Luther Newman has charge of the Walnut street school. The buildings are open four nights a week. Continuation schools at present have an enrollment of 125 boys and girls, who attend one day each week.

In Junior High Schools

This will be made possible by the addition of manual training work in the junior high schools, and will give all boys much of the experience by the time they enter the senior high school, with the result that many needs of the school district may be made right in the shops of the boys' high school.

To Fit Up Shops

This plan, however, is not being completed in the immediate future, Dr. Downes said, as shops are to be put up right in the buildings for the practical part of the manual courses. This puts all the students under the same instructor for the entire year and gives them the advantage of instruction while at work.

Fall Military Funeral to be Accorded General

San Antonio, Feb. 20. — Definite arrangements for the burial in the National Cemetery here at the Presidio of Major General Frederick Funston, who died suddenly last night at San Antonio, Texas, have not been completed early to-day.

President and High Officials Express Deep Regret Over Sudden End

Washington, Feb. 20. — President Wilson and other high officials as well as army officers expressed deep regret to-day over the sudden death of Major General Frederick Funston at San Antonio last night.

SERVICES FOR GEN. FUNSTON AT SAN FRANCISCO

Leading Military Figure in U. S. Dies Suddenly in San Antonio Hotel

San Antonio, Texas, Feb. 20. The body of Major General Frederick Funston, who died here suddenly last night, will be taken to San Francisco to-night for burial.

Short services will be held at Fort Sam Houston late this afternoon and the body will be transferred to a Southern Pacific train for San Francisco. It will be accompanied by Captain Fitzhugh Lee, aide to General Funston, and a guard of six enlisted men.

According to Lieutenant Colonel H. W. Ireland, General Funston's physician, the death of the general was practically instantaneous.

Although he was quickly removed to a room in the hotel where he had collapsed and restorative measures attempted they were of no avail. The heart affection which caused death first appeared, according to Colonel Ireland, in 1914, but had not been considered alarming.

Born Fighter. Though only 5 feet 5 inches tall and weighing about 120 pounds, Major General Funston was a fighter, a breeder, but not by training.

General Funston came to San Antonio from San Francisco in February, 1915, as southern department commander. He was also in command of the National Guard, following Villa's raid on Columbus, N. M., in March, 1916.

General Funston had commanded the largest army gathered in a single department since the Civil War.

Major General Pershing notified the War Department to-day that he had assumed command of the southern department embracing the American forces on the Mexican border which post was held by Major General Funston.

Secretary Baker said General Pershing's succession was automatic, he being the next in grade to General Funston. General Pershing will retain command until a permanent successor is named by the War Department.

Maj.-Gen. Funston's Life of Continual Action

Kansas City, Mo., Feb. 20. — Major General Funston's life was one of continual adventure. His father, Edward P. Funston, a prominent Democratic politician in Kansas early in his life, although it was not displayed in any sense of disobedience.

When out of school, young Funston took up newspaper work on the Kansas City Times and later on the Fort Smith Evening Post.

When the baggagemen found their increase was not included in yesterday's checks they decided to kick. It was said that Philadelphia baggagemen and others have had their wages increased and the local force wanted similar recognition of their services.

Local officials were unable to give any information as to future increases. The readjustment in progress since November 1, 1916, is in the hands of the officials at Philadelphia.
