that permit shacks that cannot help but breed disease. There is no need, they say, to make invalids of whole families simply because they haven't money enough to pay high rents.

In the southern section of the city a woman and twelve children were found existing in a shantabed that has no roof but the sky above.

At another home on a third street, the shadow of what was once a stalwart boy in blue, lies waiting the end. Years of confinement with a diseased leg gave the white plague a chance to start its deadly work.
