Hold Balance of Power

WASHINGTON, D. C., March 3.—Congress adjourns to-morrow with the control of the next House still in dispute.

As the result of the death of Representative Conroy, of New York, the Republicans appear to have the lead. They now have 215 votes assured, it is conceded, while the Democrats have 214. Reports also have reached here that three newly-elected Democrats are seriously ill. No successor to Mr. Conroy will be elected before next November, it is believed.

GET READY TO ARM AMERICAN SHIPS

St. Louis to Be First to Leave With Protecting Guns on Deck

New York, March 3.—The six passenger ships of the American Line held in this harbor by the German blockade are ready to take on guns as soon as Congress authorizes the government to arm American merchant vessels. A naval constructor and two ordnance officers from the navy yard continued to-day an inspection of the American Line ships.

Rex Garage Will be Greatly Improved

Mexico Denies Having Deal With Germany to Wage War on U. S.

Guadalajara, Mex., March 3.—General Carrancillo Aguilera, the provisional minister of foreign relations to-day formally denied that the Mexican Government had been approached by Germany with the object of forming an alliance hostile to the United States. The statement given out by the Mexican Foreign Minister says: "The Government of Mexico has not received in behalf of the Government of Germany any proposal for an alliance looking toward war with the United States."

He will be taken on the trip by Sergeant Ocker, of the Army aviation corps. Mr. Bleakley made the trip with Sergeant Ocker just before the opening of Congress last December.

Japan Ridiculous Idea of Warring on America

Tokio, March 3.—Japan has received no proposition from either Mexico or Germany directly or indirectly to join in a possible war against the United States, Viscount Montono Japanese Foreign Minister, informed the Associated Press yesterday. Viscount Montono said he considered such an idea ridiculous, it being based on the outrageous presumption that Japan would abandon her ally, if Mexico received the proposal, Viscount Montono added, that country showed intelligence in not transmitting it to Japan.

DEMOCRATS LOSE VOTE

Washington, D. C., March 3.—Representative Michael F. Conroy, of New York City, a Democratic member of Congress for four terms and re-elected for a fifth, died at a hospital here yesterday after a long illness from kidney trouble. He was 47 years old. In spite of his ailing health he has been at the Capitol quite regularly until last week, and as a member of the Ways and Means Committee had worked hard in connection with framing the revenue bill and other legislation.
