GERMANY HOPES PLOT MAY INVOLVE JAPAN AND U. S.

London, March 6. — The German government's plan for choosing Mexico and Japan in war with the United States, in event of hostilities between Germany and America, was defended in an address before the Reichstag by the foreign secretary, Dr. Alfred Zimmermann, as quoted in a Reuter dispatch from Amsterdam.

"For the dispatch of these instructions a secure way was chosen which at present is at Germany's disposal. How the Americans came into possession of the text which went to America in special secret code we do not know.

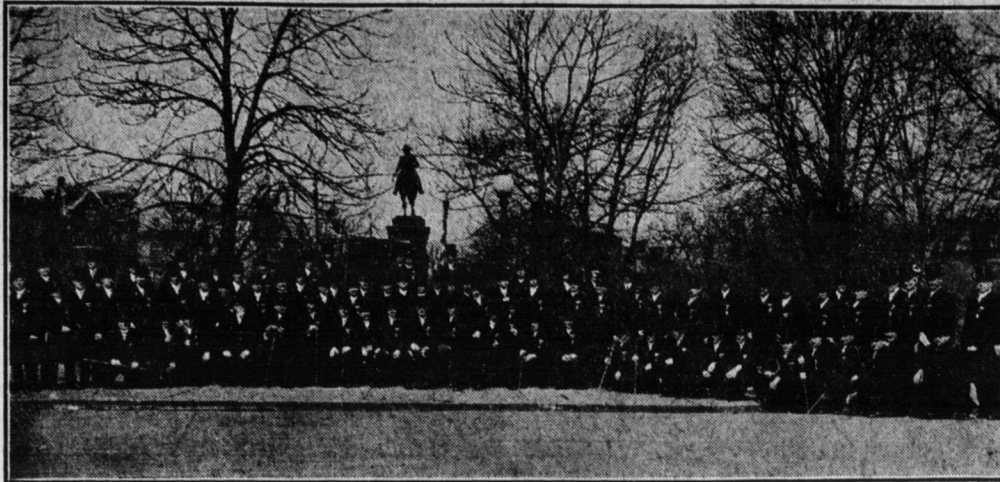

WILL NOT GRANT SPRING COAL CUT

Dealers Declare Usual Fifty Cent Reduction Will Not Be Made

Because of an unusually heavy demand for coal, Harrisburg dealers will not grant the usual April 1 reduction of fifty cents a ton to consumers.

An official of the Wallis Coal Company stated that while no official announcement has been made regarding the price of coal this spring, he does not anticipate any change in the domestic coal market, although steam coal would be uncertain in price as it has been all winter.

Heavy Orders on Hand J. B. Montgomery, one of the largest dealers in the city also believes that the spring reduction will not be made owing to the heavy demand. He stated that the operators at the present time have more orders than they can fill within sixty days.

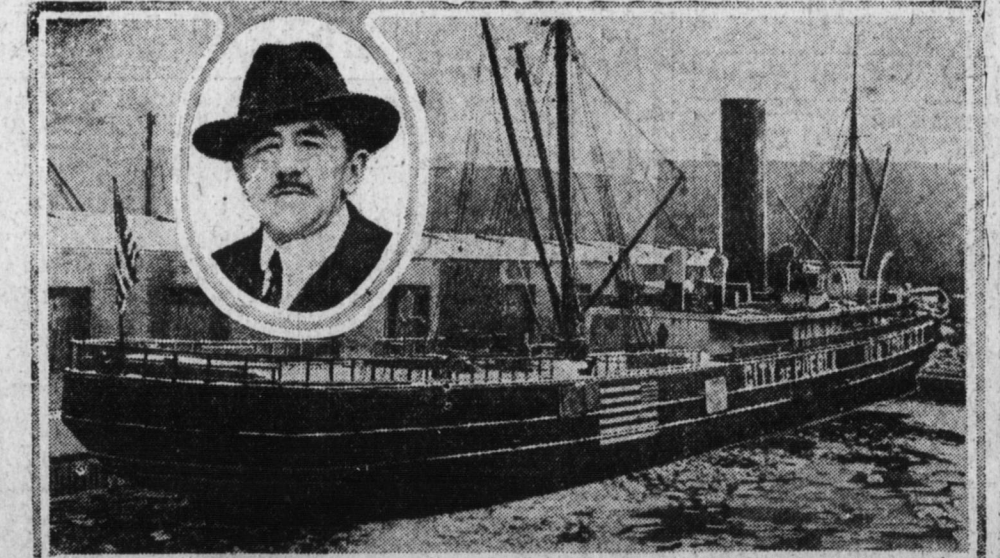
