The State's Forestry Department has been assured by ninety-five water companies that they are interested in restoring tree cover to the hills on their watersheds, and applications are alisted for over 100,000 trees to be used for this purpose. The Department has agreed to make free examination of all planting sites with a view to destainling the best method of replace water supply.
