Washington, March 23.—First steps by the new Russian government toward the emancipation of Jews in Russia were reported today to the State Department by Ambassador Francis, who said that all restrictions limiting the rights of Jews to enter universities and schools in Russia have already been removed and that they are now permitted to enter any school or university in the empire.
