

RAILROAD SHARES DOMINATE MARKET

Sweeping Movement Begun Yesterday Assumes Wide Proportion; Coalers Prominent Features by Gaining One to Two Points

New York, March 24. — Yesterday's sweeping movement in railway shares assumed wider proportions to-day, dealings in representative issues of that group as well as the shares of minor roads dominating the short session. Coalers were prominent features at gains of one to two points for Reading, Norfolk and Western, Lehigh Valley and Erie. Similar advances were recorded by St. Paul, Northern Pacific, Southern Pacific, New York Central, Illinois Central, Chicago and North Western, Southern Railway pfd., Missouri Pacific pfd., and Wabash pfd. Coalers were extremely active with United States Steel, Baltimore Locomotive, Wilson Packing, Matting pfd., and Virginia Iron were included among the other strong stocks. Shipments and motors were irregular. Realizing sales reduced most gains at the end. The closing was strong. Sales were estimated at 550,000 shares. Bonds were firm.
