PATRIOTIC FERVOR PERVADES MASONS

Robert Burns Lodge Observes Anniversary With Great Celebration

Patriotism was the keynote of the forty-seventh anniversary of the granting of the charter to Robert Burns Lodge, 464, F. and A. M., last night in Masonic Temple. The scheme of decoration carried out the patriotic effect. Two large flags were draped in the rear of the speakers' table. An electric flag that flashed red, white and blue had been constructed on the balcony of the hall.

Reference was frequently made by the speakers to the present international crisis. Jesse E. B. Cunningham, a Past Master of Harrisburg Lodge, No. 629, was toastmaster. The principal speakers were N. Frank Heckler, superintendent of Masonic Homes, Elizabethtown, Pa.; Warren S. Seipp, of Towson, Maryland, and Judge Abraham M. Beltler, Warden of the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania.

Strikes Kept Keynote
In the regular anniversary exercises previous to the banquet Arthur H. Hull delivered an eloquent address of welcome which struck the keynote of the patriotic impulse of the evening. He called attention to the long line of patriotic men who have served their country as members of the Masonic fraternity, starting with George Washington and all the members of his staff.
