BUFFALO BILL'S ASSOCIATE DEAD

Major Burke Was Frequent Visitor to Harrisburg During Long Career

Washington, D. C., April 13.—Major John M. Burke, former scout in Indian wars and for nearly half a century associated with the late Colonel William F. Cody (Buffalo Bill) as publicity representative, died of pneumonia here yesterday, aged 74 years.

Major Burke toured the United States and Europe with the Wild West show and, like Colonel Cody, was honored by the ruling heads of the old world. He was in Washington when the long companion, Colonel Cody, is believed to have hastened Major Burke's end. He never lived in one place more than a few months at a time during the last forty years of his life. When he registered at hotels he wrote the words "United States opposite his name."

Major Burke was a frequent visitor to Harrisburg and knew his friends by name. No matter how many months or years elapsed, he remembered his acquaintances in telling of the events of the late James Russ. He told many stories of his exploits. He furnished interesting news items for local readers.

"Our National Guard with its splendid record of service is near future into the national service, leaving this great Commonwealth with its millions of people and billions of assets without any effective protection beyond that which the small state Constabulary force can provide. "In a similar crisis which occurred when the Guard went to the border, a personal assurance to me upon my own initiative was perhaps the only thing that prevented us from having serious disturbances in the Commonwealth. This uncertain method of trying to maintain peace should not again be put to the test, but the Commonwealth by law and in a large way should proceed immediately to provide for some plan of home defense, which may be in the form of State reserves of any other form that in your judgment may be wise. "I am particularly laying upon you now the important proposition of preparing whatever legislation may be necessary to organize in this Commonwealth under law such a system of defense as will secure to our people safety in all their possessions and in their own individual selves. Will you be kind enough to give this matter immediate consideration?"

AID FOR SOLDIERS' FAMILIES PLANNED

be an additional tax on American business. It is understood everybody would be asked to contribute to this fund. Information obtained from authoritative sources in Great Britain and Canada as to how the problem was handled there disclosed what are de-

scribed as the "most staggering kind of experiences. It appeared that belatedly the war, suddenly, prominent firms and corporations in a burst of patriotism publicly announced that they would give full pay during the war to every man who bore arms. This was intended, it was explained, to encourage enlistment.

Offers Too Generous. Something like ruinous confusion and chaos threatened in many of the important industries of Great Britain and Canada after a year or more of this drain upon business the American manufacturers were informed. The generous offers made at the beginning of the war set a pace which public sentiment fostered and encouraged, but which business was unable to keep up. The result has been the investigation showed that undertakings made by heads of firms throughout the industries to their employees had to be canceled, and the entire method of dealing with the problem in Great Britain and Canada has had to be readjusted.

Employers who had promised their employees to give them back their own jobs found it impossible to fulfill their promises. Many came back maimed and injured, and after two years of war, the army and temporary help had been created in the factories. The problem of getting rid of this temporary help on the return of the soldiers proved a difficult one.

Need Selective Conscription. The employer in Great Britain and Canada would, first of all, it was expected, to give them back their jobs, and even from this first draft, send back to the factories every man who was a skilled workman.

The British and Canadian governments have decided, the American manufacturers have been informed, to pay a "subsistence allowance" to dependent families, presenting a figure sufficient for food and rent alone. That has been figured out to be \$51.68 a month for a family of two adults and three children, paid by the Government direct to the dependent family.

Separation Allowance. Then there is the separation allowance of \$2 a month per man, for moderate comforts clothes etc. and the "compassionate allowance" made at the discretion of a central agency distributing the fund in exceptional cases.

These "separate" and "compassionate" allowances are not paid by the Government but "come out of a national patriotic fund raised by voluntary public subscriptions.

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
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Cost Is Economical

The section by which the President might order the operation of part of a road's rolling stock is considered of the greatest importance. It would permit the government to obtain the same service that it would if the line were taken over and at the same time prove economical in time and cost, it is believed. Compensation for the use of rolling stock by the government would be fixed by the Interstate Commerce Commission. Coupled with the proposed increase of the personnel of the Interstate Commerce Commission would be a provision to subdivide it with the purpose of expediting business. As now constituted the commission finds itself impossible to keep abreast of its work. No special provision, other than permitting the President to use the military to guard the operation of trains is made against strikes.



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
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
