In this connection, we desire to thank the Monotype Company and its representatives who have been here from time to time, for their uniformly courteous treatment.

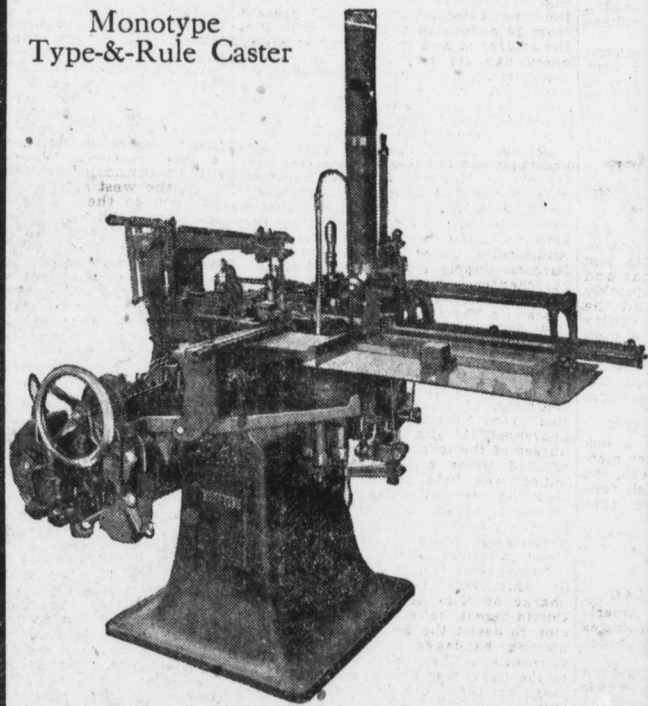
