



It is an organization which is attracting much attention. Boys who are too young at present to enter the army are getting real train-

enter the army are getting real training in the only way possible through organizations of this kind.

In the Stevens Memorial Guards there are three companies—Company "A," composed of boys between the ages of 16 and 25, and companies "B" and "C" comprising boys between the ages of 10 and 16. There are already enrolled 235 boys representing seven different churches so that the movement is far from a denominational organization.
