

UNSEATED LAND FOR FARM USES

Senator Salus Takes in Important Bill; to Probe Lunacy High Up

Senator Salus, Philadelphia, introduced in the Senate last night a bill providing for the appropriation of unseated lands, to increase the food supply. The bill would create a commission of five citizens, to be known as the Commission of Alimentary Sustainment. The commission shall have the power to acquire lands not to exceed 200,000 acres by the same method used in the acquisition of land for park purposes. The food products to be raised on the lands shall be distributed, first, to the military and naval service of the United States; second, citizens of the State who may be employed and engaged in the military or naval service of the United States; third, to inmates of all strictly public institutions; fourth, to institutions of purely public charity in the State.

The products are to be sold at or below cost of production, as the commission may deem proper. Excess products after the above preferred distribution shall be sold at current market prices. The bill provides for an appropriation of \$2,000,000 to carry out its provisions.

To Probe Lunacy, Away Up

Senator Joseph W. Stewart, of Greene county, by request of his constituent, he said, introduced in the Senate last night a bill providing for a commission to investigate the physical and mental condition of the heads of the various departments of the State Government to ascertain whether they are suffering hallucinations on rats, or other forms of insanity. The bill provides for a commission to examine and license practitioners of drugless therapeutics who were defeated by 23 yeas in the House after an hour's debate.

H. M. Brooks Is Named Federation Organizer on Gompers' Recommendation

H. M. Brooks, president of the Central Labor Union was named last night as the labor leader from the Harrisburg district to become organizer for the American Federation of Labor. Samuel Gompers, president of the Federation requested that such an action be taken. Brooks will probably receive official appointment in a few days.

Shippings, the weak features of the previous day, were steady in the State, short covering, Marine, preferred making an extreme advance of 1 3/8 points, with a point for Atlantic Gulf and West Indies. Ohio Gas featured the more speculative issues at a gain of 2 1/4 points.

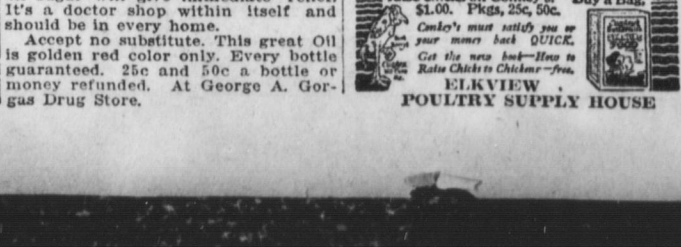
