

STATE GIVING SEEDLINGS AWAY

3,800,000 to Be Used in Reforesting Operations in Pennsylvania

Spring planting plans for the Pennsylvania State forests, allotting 3,800,000 forest tree seedlings for this year's reforestation operations, have been approved by Commissioner of Forestry Robert E. Conklin.

Following is the allotment of trees by counties: Centre, 355,835; Potter, 732,823; Tioga, 207,000; Clearfield, 274,000; Cameron, 274,400; Clinton, 200,400; Somerset, 227,500; Pike, 210,000; Union, 153,000; Huntingdon, 142,000; Franklin, 143,000; Adams, 48,000; Lycoming, 14,200; Bedford, 3,000; Perry, 43,000; Elk, 81,000; Cumberland, 18,000; Monroe, 45,000; total, 3,773,410.

This number is made up of the following species: White pine, 1,709,690; Scotch pine, 500,000; pitch pine, 177,400; Norway spruce, 390,010; European larch, 24,875; Japanese larch, 7,500; white ash, 11,025; willow cuttings, 277,000; Douglas fir, 3,400; miscellaneous, 1,000. Most of the trees are two years old, and from six to eighteen inches high.

This year's planting will bring the total reforested area in Pennsylvania up to about 15,000 acres, and the total number of trees planted to about 25,000,000. If the amounts asked for in the department's budget are granted, reforestation operations will be conducted on a much larger scale during the next two years.
