A recently issued bulletin from the headquarters of the Military Training Camps Association in Pennsylvania indicates that "the government will furnish transportation to these camps, subsistence during the training period, rifles, haversacks, mess and cooking outfits, tentage, cots, bedding, including blankets and such other articles of a general nature as may be necessary. Men are urged to provide their own uniforms before leaving for camp, and although there is no authority for such statement, it is believed that attendants at the camp will later be reimbursed for the uniforms as well.
