


Issues; Trades Take Profit

New York, April 25.—(Wall Street)

U. S. Steel was the noteworthy feature of to-day's early trading, the first transaction in that stock consisting of 15,000 shares at 112\(^1\) to 112\(^3\), a gain of 1\(^3\) points in recognition of the extra 3 per cent dividend declared yesterday. Advances of a point were registered by other industrials, equipments and supply issues, with a point for Union Pacific, Much of the initial advance was soon lost, Steel reacting almost a point on profit taking. Ohio Gas, oils and shippings also fell back.

The setback after the opening proved of brief duration, leaders speedily throwing off professional pressure. Steel rebounded from its minimum of 111\(^3\) to 113\(^3\) and Utahl Copper led the metals, advancing 2\(^1\) points on announcement of heavy government purchases. Ohio Gas more than retrieved its loss of 2\(^3\). Bethlehem Steel new stock substituted a one point decline with a gain of almost 2 points and a similar recovery was registered by Texas Company. The strength of maines caused hasty covering of shorts in that group. Rails were in better demand, but tractions moved uncertainly.




