The two remaining dances to be given by the Senior class this term will be held in Handshaw's Hall, May 4 and May 18.

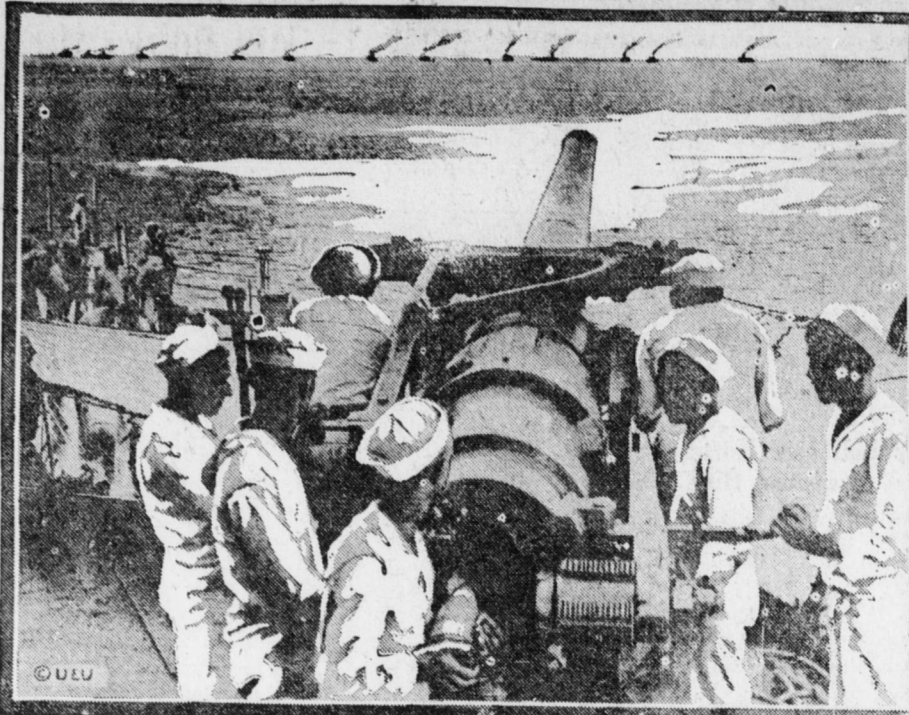
