Crafts spoke last night in the hall of the House of Representatives and following the addresses more than 500 citizens of Harrisburg adopted a resolution petitioning President Wilson to use his power to make the United States dry during the war.

Mechanicsburg Man Dies in Hospital From Fall

Mechanicsburg, Pa., May 2.—Powers W. Schroeder, steward of the Mechanicsburg Club, died at the Carlisle Hospital last evening from concussion of the brain, caused by a fall at the building on Monday evening. Mr. Schroeder, entering the front door at the clubhouse, when it is thought he had a stroke of apoplexy. He fell backward down the steps, striking his head on the pavement. He was picked up and taken to the hospital, but never regained consciousness. Mr. Schroeder was 47 years old and is survived by two brothers and two sisters: George Schroeder, of Reading; R. Byron Schroeder, of Mechanicsburg; Mrs. Glen Houston, of New York City; and Mrs. John D. Falter, of Mechanicsburg. The body will be brought to Mechanicsburg for burial, but no funeral arrangements have been made.
