"Liberty Loan" of Two Billion Dollars Will Be First U. S. Offering

Washington, May 3.—Secretary McAdoo has announced that the first offering of bonds authorized under the war finance law would be a \$2,000,000 "liberty loan" issue, open to popular subscription.

Although many organizations in addition to the banks of the country will be utilized in floating the bonds, the twelve federal reserve banks and their designated agents in their respective districts, receiving subscriptions, delivering the bonds, and caring for other details. The proceeds of the issue will be deposited in as large a number of banks throughout the country as practicable, and will be withdrawn gradually.

Interest on the bonds will be payable semiannually on January 1 and July 1. Details as to their denomination, it was announced, will be small as to place the bonds within the reach of every investor.

Baseball Stars Who Are Open to War Draft; Clean Up Both Leagues

New York, May 2.—Some one asked Ben Johnson if baseball would "suffer" through selective conscription, and he instantly resented the word. Approximately 214 men in both big leagues will be drafted in the fall, goes out before the end of the season. One hundred and thirteen of these will come from the American League and 101 from Governor Tener's circuit.

The fact that the American League clubs, for the most part, are being drilled constantly will have little effect, for what they are learning in baseball drilling camps would be only a beginning to the instructions they would receive in a big army encampment.
