VETERANS MAKE MEMORIAL PLANS

Parade to Precede Decoration of Graves; the Rev. Mr. Lauffer Orator

The memorial committee of Sergeant Samuel W. Lascomb Post, 851, G. A. R. is arranging a program for Memorial Day, May 30.

A new feature of the decorating scheme to be followed out in the cemetery will be introduced. The committee plans to have the cemetery divided into eight sections.

Interesting Resume of Orders Issued by National Guard Headquarters

(Discharges from the National Guard because of marriage will be restricted to men who were married before war was declared between the United States and Germany according to a general order issued by the Adjutant General's Department republishing some of the orders from the War Department.)

A significant order directs that all officers familiarize themselves with mobilization regulations and that "all organizations should take immediate steps to put themselves in complete readiness for a call into Federal service." It is also stated that "great haste is not the main object to be sought nor is it essential that the object be brought to the National Guard into Federal service and begin their training under the supervision of the department commanders."
