When Premier Hughes' attention was called to thi speech and he was asked in the House of Representatives whether he would take steps under the war precautions act to prevent men who had taken the oath of allegiance from giving "utterance to such treasonable and disloyal statements," he replied: "A man who after taking the oath makes such statements is not in my opinion fit even to be guillotined."
