Suggestions that Pennsylvania, the

champion buckwheat raising State of the Union, increase the acreage de-voted to-the grain that makes the flour that makes the batter, that makes the delicious cake, are about to be made by State officials who have been studying the acreage devoted to raising of foodstuffs in the Keystone Commonwealth. This State raised between four and five million bushels of buckwheat last year, more than any other State by thousands of bushels, and it has been figured out that some of the run-down or rough land could be profitably devoted to the raising of this cereal. There is money in it, too, say the officials. For years the production of buckwheat has been growing in Pennsylvania, and it is believed that in the next two years there can be such a acreage planted as would make certain the pre-eminence of the State in that line for years to come. Steps are also being taken to encourage people to raise larger quantities of beans and a suggestion that the State buy up large quantities of the standard varieties and sell them to people who will agree to plant under certain conditions has been considered. It has, however, been decided by the powers that be that buying up of beans, like the proposal for the State to buy up the seed potatoes, would be going a little too far. It is believed, especially among men interested in legislative matters, that it is only a question of a short time until the State will be making appropriations to insure supplies of seed vegetables and even seeds themselves. A steady demand for such materials for farming at prices within the reach of all has been noticed the last few years and sentiment in favor of such State enterprises, which would favor sales in small quantities, has been growing even among those who are opposed to governmental regulation as a matter of principle.
