

STORMY TIME IN NIGHT SESSION

House Discharges Committee From Consideration of a Bill That Disappears

Challenges of rulings by Speaker Baldwin and charges of attempts to "pickle" a bill marked last evening's session of the House. It was the stormiest of the whole year and as a result the Woodward bill carrying the general amendments to the Workmen's Compensation law, except the proposal to increase the rate from 50 to 62.3, was ordered reported to the House.

General Brown and Secretary of the Commonwealth Woods were kept busy answering questions about procedure. The governor explained the general plan in much detail.

The Governor said that in Pittsburgh and Scranton the mayor and the board of registration will constitute the central board, the mayor to be chairman. This board will divide the city into districts of 25,000 population and will appoint a board of registration in each of the districts.

Third-Class Cities. In third-class cities the central board will consist of the mayor, the city solicitor and the medical agent of the State, the mayor to be chairman.

Norristown, which has a population of more than 20,000 but is still a third-class city, will be divided into three districts, each with a registrar for each and every precinct or voting place in your county.

"FULL CREW" LAW WARMLY DEBATED

Railroad Representatives and Brotherhood Officials Argue For and Against Suspension

The Senate bill to suspend the full crew law for the war and six months thereafter was debated for over four hours before a joint meeting of the legislative railroad committees in the Senate chamber.

Both sides had half a dozen or more speakers and at the close some remarks by Joseph P. Gaffney, of Philadelphia, counsel for the railroad men stirred up William I. Schaffer, Chester, to some sharp retorts.

The chief argument of the men urging the repeal was that the railroad employees under the full crew law were needed in other work in the present crisis while the railroad employees' representatives said there had been hysteria.

The Philadelphia Transit bills also had a hearing or rather an inquest because the death of the bills was made certain. The hearing failed to be as impressive as planned.
